Óisin Seoige

Óisin is a resident of Glennbay. His property is on the beach front. He applied to secure funding to reinforce the boundary fence on the property. He feels that the council don't do enough to maintain the beach and he is tired of plastics and other waste materials turning up on his property.

Glennbay Community College

Glennbay Community College has a well-earned reputation for promoting activism in the community. They have an active Green Schools Committee and they hope to use some of the funding on equipment to allow a committee of students to do a regular litter pick on the beach front. They also want to use some of the money to bring a guest speaker in to meet with students to talk about the importance of keeping the coastal area clean and plastics and other waster materials out of the ocean. If they receive enough funding they hope to ban plastic bottles from their school and implement a keep-cup system of school water bottles.

The Emporium

The Emporium is a local independent coffee shop. Their ethos has always been centred on promoting local food products and maintaining a low impact on the environment. They firmly believe in keeping food-miles low and using environmentally friendly, decomposable coffee cups when the need for a take-away arises. They are hoping to use the funding to implement a clean-up initiative where they will give patrons a free coffee for collecting rubbish on the beach front. The funding will be spent on collection buckets, gloves and advertising the initiative.

The Glennbay Environmentals

The Glennbay Environmentals are a local voluntary group made up of 17 members. They have been working in the area for the past six years on a variety of projects. They participate in outreach in the local schools and complete local beach clean-ups every couple of months.

They are hoping to use the funding to get recycling bins in the beachfront area. They also want to fund summer camps for primary school children on the beach front. The camps will focus on the local environment, recycling and climate change.
